It is our pleasure to announce the availability of an exciting opportunity for high school students in the Greater Kansas City area. This summer the University of Missouri Kansas City, Institute for Human Development will host their fourteenth Kansas City Summer Transportation Institute (KCSTI) that will be held on the campus of UMKC June 19<sup>th</sup> – July 7<sup>th</sup> (9:00am – 4:00pm; Monday –Friday).

The KCSTI is a fun, interactive, engaging, and hands on learning opportunity designed to create awareness and stimulate interest in the wealth of career opportunities that exist in the transportation industry. With one in seven careers being transportation related, this Institute offers a tremendous opportunity for students to explore future transportation related career opportunities. The KCSTI is sponsored by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and is open to students attending public and private high schools in the greater Kansas City area (both Missouri & Kansas schools). There is NO COST to you for attending.

The KCSTI will introduce students to a wide variety of exciting career opportunities. Students will participate in interactive projects and field trips related to the transportation industry. The following is a sample of some activities:

- ⇒ Touring numerous transportation industries such as General Motors, KC Downtown Airport, Missouri Department of Transportation, KCATA, Garmin, Airline History Museum, MCC School of Business and Technology and SE3 Civil Engineering to highlight those employers who hire persons with various engineering degrees
- ⇒ Learning about the past, present, and future of transportation services and careers, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) related career options
- ⇒ Building model bridges, experiencing a flight simulator, and other hands on learning opportunities
- ⇒ Developing team skills through such experiences as the Ironwoods Challenge Course
- ⇒ Opportunity for numerous fun & interactive education and recreation activities

Students will also participate in activities designed to develop leadership skills and introduce them to college life. Participants will leave the KCSTI with an appreciation of the numerous career opportunities available to them in the transportation industry. Approximately twenty (20) rising ninth, tenth or eleventh grade students will receive full scholarships to participate in the three-week summer program.



The KCSTI is a non-residential program and students will travel to and from the UMKC campus each day. Scholarships will include the following:

Teachers, guidance counselors, or others should identify students who may benefit from and be interested in attending the KCSTI and assist them with completing the forms in the enclosed application package.

Notification of acceptance will be made by the KCSTI to each of the selected students.

All students with an interest in transportation as a career are encouraged to apply, however, preferred qualifications include:

- Students in the  $9^{th}$ ,  $10^{th}$ , or  $11^{th}$  grade for the 2017-2018 school year.
- Have a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Have an interest in a Transportation, Engineering, Science, or Technology related career.

## To apply:

- Complete attached application
- Include one letter of recommendation
- Provide an essay. (Why student wants to participate in the KCSTI and how it can assist in meeting individual career goals) (one typed or clearly printed page)
- Provide transcript

The selection team will also consider the geographical location of applicants to ensure representation from all areas of greater Kansas City area.

Return all applications to the address below. Review of applications will begin on **April 28, 2017 and continue until the Institute is filled.**
